

Tynt Meadow

Tynt Meadow is named after a meadow on the site where monks settled in 1835, as Trappist beers tend to be named after the place in which the monastery is situated. The meadow is pictured below. Located in Coalville, Leicestershire, Tynt Meadow is the only Trappist brewery in England.

- Mahogany-coloured, with a subtle, warm red hue, and a lasting beige head.
- Aroma carries hints of dark chocolate, liquorice, and rich fruit flavours.
- Full-bodied, gently balancing the taste of dark chocolate, pepper, and fig. Tynt Meadow leaves a warm, dry finish on the palate.
